Signs of Overdose:

- · Small constricted "pinpoint pupils"
- · Falling asleep/losing consciousness
- · Slow, weak or no breath
- · Choking and gurgling sounds
- · Limp Body
- Cold or clammy skin
- · Discolored skin (blue/grey)
- Vomiting
- Slurred or loss of speech
